In 1965, the Elementary and Secondary Education Act (ESEA) was passed under the leadership of President Lyndon B. Johnson. Title I was the largest federal assistance program for our nation's schools. The goals remain the same today as it did in 1965 to provide a high-quality education for every child.

The federal government provides funding to states each year for Title I. To receive funds, each state must submit a plan describing what all children are expected to know and able to do. The plan also outlines the high quality academic performance standards that all children are expected to meet and ways to measure the student's progress.
